




VOICE OF SURABI

On the road to financial independence

When we speak about empowered women, we visualize women occupying the positions of power; women in politics, in law, in corporate sector, in health, media or academics. To empower the women and enable them to become financially independent. SURABI initiated the Micro-credit program since 2016. The program benefitted 1200 slum women and transformed them to as breadwinners of their families. Their children are being academically empowered for their better future.



A loan distribution event was held on 25th August 2022 at Joe Tech Campus, Basin Bridge. 50 individual SHG women received Rs.40,000 each for their income generation activities. Mr. Azhagesan, Assistant Commissioner of Pulianthope exhorted the importance of women leadership and economic independence. So far, 100 women continue to be entreprenuers through this intervention



Our impact on urban slum women



I'm **Hemavathi**, 20 years old from Imaigal SHG. I'm studying B.com 3rd year. My father is a bus conductor and

my mother is Tailor. I have applied for this loan for my education (Semester fees). This loan will be repaid by my parents but I do support my parents to repay the loan (I will go for part-time job).

I'm Poonguzhali from Nightingale SHG. I'm 30 years old. My mother-in law had been selling vegetables. Unfortunately, she



passed away due to old age. Now I'm interested in doing the same job. For that, I'm getting this loan. I just planned to sell the vegetables in a push cart near my house.

Along with them Fr Joseph Leo, SURABI director and Fr Alphonse Arulanandam, DBSSS director were also present in the program. Mr. Azhagesan addressed the gathering by sharing his experience to the women. He motivated the women for their financial independence and to be the harbingers for change in their locality.

Life without identity Breaking the barriers

BRAVE (Building Resilience and Vocational Excellence) project is one of the new initiatives of SURABI which primarily focuses on social transformation and upliftment of Irular, Thurumbar and Gypsy communities

Through Sustainable Livelihood and creating awareness of Human Rights for around 4460 male, 4900 female among Youth, Women, and Disabled either directly or indirectly proposed to be benefitted.

On 31.08.2022 the project, BRAVE was launched by Fr. Jebamalai Irudayaraj SJ, Provincial of Jesuit Chennai Province, and Fr. K.M. Jose Kochamkunnel SDB, Provincial of Salesian Chennai Province. Fr. Joseph Leo, Director SURABI and representing the Gypsy, Thurumbar and Irular Communities.

At this juncture, study on the Socio-Economic status of the marginalized communities in Northern Tamil Nadu was presented by Fr. Selvaraj Arulnathan S.J, Director of Loyola College, Vettavalam.

This project has been initiated with collaboration of rectors in reaching out to the target groupin various locations of the province.

Accordingly, started the beginning process of meeting the Rectors from the targeted locations to collect the data of the Irular, Thurumbar and Gypsy who survived there and to execute the BRAVE project effectively.









Up-Skilling of Teachers

As per the UNICEF, one in seven adolescents aged 10 to 19 is estimated to live with a diagnosed mental disorder globally, and approximately 46,000 dies from suicide every year; it is among the top five causes of death in this age group. This indicates that the role of a teacher in contemporary situations is beyond academics. They need the training to fit as a tutor, coach, mentor, counsellor, instructor, and friends to establish a well-ordered classroom with proper techniques to ensure the mental well-being of students.



The capacity building program was conducted for the 28-08-22 BEST project tutors on at Mount Don Bosco, Kotagiri. A one-day participatory workshop improved capacity of tutors through activity training program. The methodology of the workshop included participatory exercises to engage all the tutors through Power Point presentations and experience sharing and clarifications of doubts. As a result, 75 tutors were trained on child centred methods and child rights approaches. Children will be guided to reach their personal goals with self-confidence.



Visit of Rector Major to the Province



"The pastoral visit is an apostolic endeavor, an event of grace". On September 5th 2022 was the grace-filled moment in the history of SURABI, as Rector Major blessed the staff at The Citadel.

On the other for the teachers, it is an opportunity to exchange good practices that can improve the quality of teaching and learning. So far, we have linked 5 INM Don Bosco Schools with Boys and Girls and 14 Teachers with 5 Belgian Schools.
