




DISTRIBUTION OF SCHOLARSHIP FOR COLLEGE STUDENTS



To honor Womanhood, SURABI has celebrated International Women's Day based on the topic Women's Rights in the Family Network. BRAVE Project women group and the girls from the Villages Anthoniyar Nagar, Oragadam, Aalathur, Paiyanur, Kodungalur and MGR Nagar of Tirukazhukundram attended the one-day Training program.



The programme was conducted in Don Bosco Polytechnic College, Tirukazhukundram and the Chief guest Mr Pichai Muthu, Panchayat leader and Rector Fr. Varghese Choorackal, Principal of Don Bosco College felicitated the program. The Keynote speaker P. Dasaradhan, Advocate of Madras High Court spoke about Women's Rights in the Family Network. It was more an interactive session than a speech the members of the programme asked the resource person lot of questions based on their experience. The Keynote Speaker dealt with many issues namely, a) The basic rights of women such as Domestic violence, Dowry, Discrimination, Equal remuneration act; b) Gender discrimination and how a woman in a house should be treated; c) Importance of Girls education; d) Gender roles and stereotypes. He encouraged us to utilize the Helpline number cards namely childline 1098, Women Helpline 181, Domestic Violence Helpline 1090. The women participants have taken a vow to utilize these numbers effectively as and when required. 144 Women and Girls from Irular, Thurumbar, and Gypsy communities jointly participated in the Training program. This training program made the three communities people know each other also they get the chance to know their problems and they could relate their own problems commonly.



Most of the participants shared about the problems they face on a daily basis and they were very enthusiastic to know what their rights were. The program ended with the Vote of thanks.



SURABI, Province development office has taken initiative to strengthen an environmental activities in the Don Bosco Institutions through Green Hands Project. Nature Camp was the major component of the project. It was conducted for Green Army members on 11th and 12th March 2023 at Mount Don Bosco, Kotagiri. The objective of the camp was to provide knowledge on Ecology, Environment, Biodiversity and trekking experience towards a greener future. Mr. Kalidasan -OSAI, Ms. Habeeba Fathima – Key Stone, Fr. Dolphie SDB and Bro. Antonyraj were resource persons for Nature Camp. Totally 102 students and 22 teachers from Don Bosco Institutions have benefitted through this intervention. SEXUAL REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH & RIGHTS TRAINING PROGRAM

One day Training programme was conducted on 'Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights'. In the beginning, a small orientation about Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights was given by Ms. Leni on behalf of the SURABI Trust. The participants of the training programme belong to the Irular, Gypsy, and Thurumbar communities. In all, 148 women and young girls benefitted through this training programme.

The programme was conducted in Don Bosco Polytechnic College, Tirukazhukundram. The Chief guest Fr. John Joseph, Secretary of Don Bosco College felicitated the program. The speaker, Ms. Kanchana, Project coordinator Cum SRHR trainer, Thozhamai spoke about Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights and menstruation and how women should take care of their health during this time. She also spoke about the prevailing myths and stereotypes on this topic. She gave inputs for pregnancy concern and healthy practices. The resource person spoke about vaginal health during the time of menstruation, hygienic practices. She highlighted the need of nutrition specifically for a girl child at all stages of development.
