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Empowering Educators:

"Transformative Capacity Building for BEST and DREAM Tutors"

or the past 25 years, SURA-Bl, has been focused on 135 CLCs, serving as crucial educational hubs in underserved regions. The BEST Project operates with 86 CLCs, while the DREAM project operates with 20 CLCs, both proving to be highly impactful. Through these Evening Study centers, SURABI has touched the lives of 3595 tribal and rural children residing seven key locations: Thalavadi, Kadambur, Kotagiri, Gedilam, Tiruvannamalai. Thiruka-



zhukundram, and Katpadi. On 06-08-2023, Capacity Building programme was conducted at Don Bosco, SIHARAM, specifically for tutors associated with the BEST and DREAM projects. The session, led by Fr. Anto Sagayaraj, Rector Don Bosco, SIHARAM,

focused on effective teaching through story-telling. Fr. John Christopher, Director DB-SARC, tutors learned innovative teaching methods. Fr. Joseph Leo, Director SURABI, covered creative approaches to teaching letters and sounds. A total of 43 tutors bene-

fitted from this intervention, gaining invaluable knowledge in effective learning methodologies and constitutional rights awareness. This investment in capacity building for educators promises to have a positive impact on students and the community.

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Enabling Women & Girls to reach their full potential

challenge menstruating girls and women face is often less tangible than simply the availability of infrastructure. and is rooted in social norms and beliefs. In many cultures, menstruating women are considered impure and are systematically excluded from participating in every-day activities, such as education, employment, and cultural and religious practices. Moreover. the taboos and stigmas attached to menstruation lead to an overall culture of silence around the topic. resulting in limited information on menstruation



On 7th of August menstrual hygiene training was organised for women of Gypsy community

and menstrual hygiene. Such misinformation do have ramifications on the health and dignity of girls and women. On 7th of August menstrual hygiene training was

organised for women of Gypsy community for 30 women. They were trained on bodily changes during puberty, Social myths, Menstrual products and hygiene methods. Let's create a world in which every woman and girl can manage her menstruation in a hygienic way – wherever she is – in privacy, safety and with dignity! The teachers and the school management is conscious of this need and have built systems to enhance this intervention.
